Major topics

1. **Paleontology and its subdisciplines.** Fossils and fossilization. Taphonomy. Elements of classification and nomenclature. Geological time.
2. **Major fossil groups.** Algae and plants. Protists. Sponges and cnidarians. Worms and worm-like organisms. Lophophorates. Molluscs. Arthropods. Echinoderms. Graptolites. Cephalochordates and allied groups. Vertebrates.
3. **Life emergence and its early evolution.** Bacteria, cyanobacteria and stromatolites. Banded Iron Formation. Evolution of the early eukaryotic cells. Emergence of multicellularity. Evolution's evolution.
4. **Paleozoic life evolution.** Evolution of burrowers. Early evolution of the cephalopods, brachiopods and molluscs. Paleozoic reef evolution. Evolution of the vertebrates and conquest of land. The Permian/Triassic boundary crisis.
5. **Mesozoic life evolution.** Renewed coral world. New bivalve types. Aquatic reptiles. Flying reptiles. Dinosaur evolution. Birds and their theropod ancestors. The Cretaceous/Paleogene boundary crisis.
6. **Cenozoic life evolution.** Mammalian diversification. Primate and human evolution. Modern floras.
