

## DEPARTMENT OF GEOSCIENCE COURSE OUTLINE

1. Course: GLGY 435, Field Methods

Lecture Sections:

B02: August 23 - September 05

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2. Prerequisites: Geology 311 or 333, 323, 337, 341 or 343 and 381. See also Geology Course Descriptions of the University Calendar.

Antirequisites: Credit for both Geology 435 and either Geology 437 or 439 will not be allowed.

**Notes:** Enrolment in <u>Geology 435</u> is restricted to Geology and Applied and Environmental Geology majors. Registration for non-majors will require consent of the Department. This course occurs in rugged field conditions and varying weather, for which participants must be prepared and equipped. It may occur outside Canada. Students will be required to cover food and accommodation costs, and a supplemental fee will be assessed to cover the costs of equipment and other resources.

- **3. Grading:** The University policy on grading and related matters is described sections F.1 and F.2 of the online University Calendar. In determining the overall grade in the course the following weights will be used:
  - 1. Strat section, due at 5pm on Aug 29<sup>th</sup> at 8 am. 10% of grade.
  - 2. Two field book evaluations (15%): the first on Aug 27<sup>th</sup> for 5% and the second on Sept 2nd for 10%. In both cases you will turn your field book in at the end of the day (5 pm).
  - 3. Two field map evaluations (50%): the first on Aug 28<sup>th</sup> for 10% and the second on Sept 3rd (5pm) for 40%.
  - 4. A cross-section (15%): Due on Sept 3rd at 5 pm.
  - 5. Professionalism/participation score (10%): based on my observations of your behavior and professionalism. Includes: work ethic, general behavior, punctuality, enthusiasm etc. Part of this includes sticking with you assigned partner. I expect groups of two not four or six. You will get docked professionalism points if you work in a group of three or more.

Field school schedule

On Friday Aug 22<sup>nd</sup> we will meet in the structure lab in the Earth Science Building at noon to prepare maps and discuss the field school. At 4pm we will attend a safety briefing with Lynne Maillet.

On Saturday Aug 23<sup>rd</sup> we will meet at 7 am at the loading dock of the earth Science Bldg. to load the vehicles. Once loaded we will start our Drive to drive to Pocatello Idaho where we will spend the night in the Thunderbird Motel. On Aug 24<sup>th</sup> we will complete our journey to the group camp but with a couple of stops along the way; we will stop in Bishop to do our shopping for 5 days worth of food, and we will fill up all of our water container at the Inyo National Forest ranger station (corner of HWY395 and Yaney St.). With these tasks out of the way we will drive up into the Inyo Mts. east of Big Pine and set up our camp.

Aug 25<sup>th</sup> – Field Day 1: We will do an intro to the field area and go to start our stratigraphic section measuring. We will familiarize ourselves with the stratigraphy and start measuring section.

Aug 26<sup>th</sup> – FD2: We will complete the section measuring exercise if necessary and start mapping.

Aug 27<sup>th</sup> – FD3: We will continue mapping the geology in the field area as a group with guidance from the instructor and the TA. In the afternoon the students groups will go out and start mapping independently.

Aug 28<sup>th</sup> – FD4: Mapping. The instructor and TA will be in the field area mapping as well and will touch bases with various groups during the day.

Aug 29<sup>th</sup> – FD5: Mapping.

\*Strat column due in the morning (8 am)

Aug 30<sup>th</sup> – Day off: We will head down to Bishop by 10:00am with coolers and water van as well as laundry etc. Will spend the day in Bishop getting everything sorted out and replenished and then head back to camp in the afternoon. If it is hot and the river not too high we can go for a swim before heading up to camp.

\*Field book check in the evening (5pm deadline)

Sept 3<sup>rd</sup> – FD9: Office day for finishing maps, sections, etc. All materials due by 5 pm (no exceptions). If you get everything done well ahead of time you will have time to head down to the valley for a swim. Everything needs to be packed and ready to go for the 14<sup>th</sup>. In the morning you should wake up, pack your tent, sleeping bag and sleeping pad, pack your gear in the van and be ready to go. This means that you will need to do the bulk of your packing and the camp clean up on the 3<sup>rd</sup> **before** you get down to the Camp-end party.

Sept 4<sup>th</sup> – Drive to Pocatello

Sept 5<sup>rd</sup> – Drive back to Calgary.
