Each piece of work (assignment, laboratory report, midterm test or final examination) submitted by the student will be assigned a percentage score. The student's average percentage score for the various components listed above will be combined with the indicated weights to produce an overall percentage for the course, which will be used to determine the course letter grade, bearing in mind that an F grade will result if the student does not pass the Final Examination. The conversion between course percentage and letter grade is given below. Final grades will be assigned based on the weighting scheme described above and will be converted to letter grades as follows:
